Period of Performance - 5/28/2016-5/27/2017

1.0 BACKGROUND

Appendix B-1 shall be considered an addendum to Section 5.8 of the Performance Work Statement: Additional Work to Be Performed During the Initial POP, Option Years 1-2, and the Optional Six-Month Extension.

During the twelve-month period 5/28/2016 to 5/27/2017, or longer if mutually agreed to by the parties, the Contractor shall perform configuration, integration, and training services for the following projects, which are not presented in priority order. The parties shall mutually agree to the list priorities and project timelines.

2.0 PROJECT PLANS AND SCHEDULES

The Contractor shall submit to the FALCON Program Manager and the FALCON COR/ACOR no later than ten work days after the beginning of a contract year a draft Schedule of Outcomes, listing the planned start dates of each planned outcome-based project. Based upon this Schedule of Outcomes, the Contractor shall submit to the FALCON Program Manager and the FALCON COR/ACOR no later than ten working days prior to the initiation of work on a particular outcome-based project a Project Plan and a Project Schedule. The one exception shall be for the first of the planned outcome-based projects, for which a Project Plan and a Project Schedule shall be delivered by the Contractor concurrently with delivery of the draft Schedule of Outcomes.

Project Plans, mutually agreed to by HSI and the Contractor, shall identify specific user groups, workflows and discrete tasks. The Project Plans will define the agreed upon scope of each outcome – any and all changes to the Project Plans must be mutually agreed upon by the parties and documented in weekly and/or monthly reports. Specifically, any addition of a new task within the Project Plan must be mutually agreed upon by the parties, and counterbalanced with the deletion or delay of an existing task of equal effort, as documented in weekly and/or monthly reports. Project Schedules shall list high-level tasks for a specified outcome-based project. Project Plans and Schedules may be amended by the two parties' mutual agreement.

Government delay has prevented delivery of 2015 – 2016 Period of Performance Outcomes 2, 3, and 7 prior to the conclusion of the Base Period; work associated with these Outcomes shall be referred to as "Residual Outcome Work." For Residual Outcome Work from the prior contract performance period, which will need to be completed at no additional cost during the current contract performance period, the Contractor shall deliver Revised Schedules, broken out by Outcome, no later than twenty-one (21) working days following the initiation of the current

contract performance period. These Revised Schedules shall be finalized through consultations and agreement between the Contractor and the FALCON PMO.

Regarding delay of work caused by government action or inaction, Equitable Adjustments shall take the form of adjustments in schedule with no penalty to the Contractor. In cases of extraordinary delay caused by government action or inaction (completion of work by the Contractor is anticipated to be delayed beyond one additional Period of Performance; for example, from the Base POP into Option Year 2), the government and the Contractor shall mutually agree upon a change in contract scope, at no penalty to the Contractor, whereby more feasible work of a similar magnitude shall be substituted for the work affected by an extraordinary delay. Equitable Adjustments shall not take the form of additional monetary compensation to the Contractor, due to the contract's Firm Fixed Price.

3.0 PROJECT MANAGEMENT

As part of the Draft Project Plan for each planned outcome-based project, Contractor shall identify a project lead, who will (a) coordinate all Contractor work on that particular outcomebased project; (b) manage the Project Plan and Project Schedule; and (c) report on progress and achievement of project milestones at weekly meetings with the FALCON PMO Team and to inquiries made by the FALCON Program Manager or other HSI authorities. At the Contractor's discretion, a particular employee may be assigned as project lead for more than one outcomebased project.

In addition to weekly progress meetings, the Contractor shall provide (a) quarterly briefings to which all HSI Unit Chiefs are invited to participate; and (b) twice yearly briefings to the Executive Steering Committee (ESC), coordinated with the October '16 and April '17 ESC meetings, on progress and achievement of project milestones across all outcomes.

The FALCON Program Manager shall identify a governmental project lead for each planned outcome-based project. This governmental project lead will (a) identify governmental Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) as necessary for requirements gathering, user feedback, and user testing; (b) facilitate meetings between governmental SMEs and Contractor staff; (c) coordinate agreements between the FALCON PMO and other bodies within ICE or other governmental agencies required for exchanges of data necessary for the accomplishment of the outcome-based project; (d) review/approve all changes to the Project Plan and/or Project Schedule proposed by the Contractor; and (d) alert the FALCON Program Manager and the FALCON COR/ACOR whenever schedule breeches are anticipated to occur or other problems arise which may adversely impact either project quality or the achievement of project deadlines.

All training activities conducted in support of these outcomes must be coordinated, in advance, with the FALCON Program Management Office (PMO).

During the first week of February, Contractor's project leads will meet with the FALCON PMO and other key stakeholders identified by the government to present status updates regarding any Outcome work which the Contractor estimates will not be completed by the end of the current

Period of Performance. If the delay in Outcome work is due to Government or Contractor delay—delayed access to data or delayed Palantir Cloud authorization, for example—Contractor shall present draft action plans reflecting the decreased remaining time to complete the project in the Period of Performance, which shall be finalized through consultations and mutually agreed upon by the Contractor and the FALCON PMO.

4.0 LIST OF RESIDUAL OUTCOME WORK FROM APPENDIX B (2015-2016 OUTCOMES) NOT COMPLETED DUE TO GOVERNMENT DELAY PRIOR TO 5/26/2016 WHICH SHALL BE COMPLETED DURING THE 5/28/2016-5/27/2017 PERIOD AT NO ADDITIONAL COST TO THE GOVERNMENT

Completion of some final technical elements of the following 2015-16 Outcomes are dependent upon IOC deployment of the Investigative Case Management (ICM) system, which, due to no fault of the Contractor's, has been delayed from March, 2016 to 6/20/2016 (with IOC window extending to September, 2016). Contractor shall complete all elements of the following Outcomes at the earliest date practicable, following a revised Project Schedule mutually agreed upon between Contractor and the government. Completion of this work shall not count against 2016-2017 Outcomes, as payment for this work has been made to Contractor during the 2015-2016 contract year.

Outcome 2: Modernize the Telecommunications Linking System (TLS) in order to achieve mainframe TECS independence and enhance the analytics of telecommunication data at HSI.

The Following work from Outcome 2 was completed in the Base Year and will not be counted as Residual Outcome Work:

- Work closely with ICM team to determine set of requirements for TLS integration with ICM.
- Develop solution for housing all TLS data in a way that is searchable through both ICM and FALCON.
- Simplify data import/export process to increase the number of phone subpoenas uploaded into the system.
- Develop phone deconfliction tool to provide all phone matches with corresponding cases in an easy to read display.
- Identify users with a high degree of familiarity with large scale phone record analysis and work with them to develop an analytical workflow or capability on top of TLS data.
- · Document training curriculum around new system.

The Following work from Outcome 2 will be considered Residual Outcome Work:

Deploy Modernized TLS to Production.

Outcome 7: Provide notifications to TECS/ICM records owners when their record is viewed in FALCON.

The Following work from Outcome 7 was completed in the Base Year and will not be

counted as Residual Outcome Work:

- Work with PMO to determine which records (e.g. TECS Case, ROI, etc) and actions (e.g. view in browser) should trigger a notification.
- Work with PMO to determine what data should be included on the notification and how frequently the notifications should be sent.
- Ensure TECS and ICM data is ingested in a way that enables the specific query notifications required

The Following work from Outcome 7 will be considered Residual Outcome Work:

• Deploy Outcome 7 solution to production.

Completion of some final technical elements of the following 2015-16 Outcome is dependent upon (1) IOC deployment of the Investigative Case Management (ICM) system, which, due to no fault of the Contractor's, has been delayed from March, 2016 to 6/20/2016 (with IOC window extending to September, 2016) and upon (2) Customs and Border Protection's deployment of their TECS Modernization system and associated re-routing of SEACATS data from the Electronic Data Warehouse to an as yet undetermined follow-on location, which, due to no fault of the Contractor's, has been delayed until December, 2016. Contractor shall complete all elements of the following Outcome at the earliest date practicable, following a revised Project Schedule mutually agreed upon between Contractor and the government. Completion of this work shall not count against 2016-2017 Outcomes, as payment for this work has been made to Contractor during the 2015-2016 contract year.

Outcome 3: Migration of current TECS pipeline from Electronic Data Warehouse (EDW) to new location.

The Following work from Outcome 3 was completed in the Base Year and will not be counted as Residual Outcome Work:

- Perform full analysis of data in new data warehouse and document any changes to the data between the old and new locations.
- Migrate pipeline and ingestion scripts to pull data from the new location.
- Gather feedback and make changes to modeling as mutually decided upon and prioritized by both parties.
- Evaluate any additional changes to storage locations of current case data as they arise, document changes and make necessary pipeline modifications.

The Following work from Outcome 3 will be considered Residual Outcome Work:

- Deploy the ICE TECS pipeline migration to production.
- Migrate the CBP TECS pipeline from legacy CBP TECS to Modernized CBP TECS when practicable.

- Integrate the highest-impact border crossing data sets, which may include, but are not limited to, CBP person crossing data, US-VISIT data, and Consular Consolidated Database (CCD) data.
- Integrate the highest-impact USCIS data sets for identification of persons within the U.S., which may include, but are not limited to, USCIS Person Centric Query Service (PCQS) and Customer Profile Management Service (CPMS).
- Document training curriculum around new workflows exposed with additional datasets.

- Research and identify highest-value workflows of groups that work with the illegal movement of people and money into and out of the U.S.
- Enable workflows that facilitate collaboration between HSI and its partner organizations (e.g., USCIS, ERO, CBP) to streamline investigations of illicit activity.
- Work with users to identify necessary interfaces to facilitate the use of person, goods, and money data, which may include, but is not limited to, enhancing DARTTS features. These features may include:

- Work with the users to identify and implement analytical processes and methodology to exploit these datasets with improved front-end interfaces.
- Document training curriculum around new workflows.

Outcome 3: Migrate FALCON from existing hardware into Palantir Cloud ("PCloud").

- Receive necessary ICE approval to host FALCON and all datasets in Palantir's Cloud environment.
- Migrate data pipelines and Palantir services to Palantir Cloud.
- Ensure no data loss or decreased usability from the migration to the cloud environment.

- Migrate authentication from IRMNET to DHS Authentication to enable secure authentication in Palantir Cloud.
- Provide cloud infrastructure including Combined GovCloud Instances, AWS support package, and SaaS Palantir Cloud from 09/30/2016 – 5/27/2017.
 - 0 Palantir will provide AWS GovCloud as the underlying infrastructure for the FALCON system's Staging and Production environments. Palantir Cloud (PCloud), Palantir's managed Software-as-a-Service (SaaS) offering, is the configured environment that will host all applicable components of the FALCON system. PCloud uses AWS GovCloud for its underlying infrastructure. PCloud will provide a variety of virtual cloud services that can be deployed or removed on demand to support the scale and high availability required by the FALCON system. Additionally, Palantir will provide personnel to manage and administer the FALCON environment in PCloud to ensure timely assessment and triage of issues related to the application when deployed. These personnel will have direct lines of communication to Amazon GovCloud should the need arise for additional on-site support. In summary, Palantir will be responsible for administration and maintenance of their FALCON hosting solution in PCloud, respecting change management, system availability, system performance, security, and audit requirements as set forth in Sections 3 through 13 of the FALCON-Palantir Operations and Maintenance and System Enhancements contract.
 - PCloud operates with strict security procedures and has undergone extensive auditing and review to ensure compliance with a broad landscape of regulatory requirements and standards. Palantir Cloud is SSAE 16 SOC 2 compliant. The Palantir team will work with the ICE security components including ISSO and IAD to facilitate testing and documentation as needed to validate the existing FISMA ATO. Approval to migrate production data to staging and production environments will be dependent upon explicit approval from the ICE ISSO.
 - To mitigate the risk of data breach or loss, Palantir-managed hardware security modules (HSMs) will be maintained in PCloud. These cloud-based HSMs enable secure data encryption, and will be dispersed across separate AWS regions to provide redundancy and multi-region support.
 - o The Palantir Cloud (PCloud) team will provide monthly Nessus scans of the FALCON AWS environment. (Nessus scans systems, networks, and applications for weaknesses and vulnerabilities including malware detection and web application scanning. Nessus also provides the capability to complete external network scans to scan Internet-facing IP addresses for network and web application vulnerabilities. The DB and any running applications are included in these scans and vulnerabilities that would be visible over open ports are reported.) These scans shall encompass the full range of ports and perform an authenticated scan which checks local libraries, RPMs, etc. against known vulnerabilities or associated exploits; these scans will additionally cover all of the running applications and include network scanning. Additional PCloud management services for the FALCON system will, at minimum, duplicate those provided for

ICE HSI's other two systems currently hosted in the PCloud/GovCloud environment, ICM and TLS.

- Post-deployment, the PCloud team will be responsible for providing ongoing system and operating system (OS)-level patches and updates as necessary to ensure the security of the FALCON system and the data it contains. These configuration changes will not be subject to ICE/OCIO approvals prior to implementation in PCloud and any changes applied will not impact uptime or functional/performance requirements. However, these (and any other) system-level changes will be logged and provided to the ICE ISSO on a regular basis. These logs will include information on day-to-day maintenance activities conducted by the PCloud team and FALCON support staff managing the application. Any changes that impact uptime, functional, or performance requirements will be rolled back and coordinated with ICE/OCIO and the ICE ISSO for mitigation.
- Note that all application level updates will follow appropriate approval routes through the FALCON PMO before any change is implemented.
- A dedicated network link will be required to establish connectivity between Amazon GovCloud and a DHS-designated data center with appropriate bandwidth to meet performance requirements. This network link piece will be handled separately by ICE. - Palantir will acquire an Amazon AWS support package sufficient to support the GovCloud hosting infrastructure stipulated above.

 Improve search results on Mobile: work with users to research and configure improved display of search results that will enable users to more quickly and accurately find information from their queries.

- Enable border reporting: iterate with users and deploy relevant Mobile input forms to allow personnel supporting HSI Border Crossing investigations to collect data on parties of interest.
- Enable the creation of Feeds from FALCON Mobile.
- Deploy a federated search capability for FALCON Mobile to return data on wants and warrants from NCIC. Additional datasets may be included if mutually agreed upon by both parties.
- ICAO Optical Scanning: Configure a mechanism to scan Visas, Passports, and Green Cards via a Report ID Scanner.

5.0 ESCALATION

At the beginning of each year of contract performance, the AD and DAD over the FALCON program, with the input of the ESC and of the Contractor will agree upon the addition of up to five outcomes to be completed during the upcoming year (the number of outcomes may be higher if both parties agree). If ICE and the Contractor are unable to agree upon the scope of a given outcome or set of outcomes, the Contractor will provide a detailed technical rationale as to why the outcome falls outside the scope of PWS. This written rationale shall include the level of effort and why this level of effort is not attainable and shall be presented to the ICE FALCON Program Manager and COR/ACOR within five (5) business days of the Contractor's initial announcement of lack of agreement on the Statement of Outcomes. In this scenario, HSI management and the Contractor's management will use this information to reach a final agreement on the Statement of Outcomes statement to which both HSI and the Contractor agree.

Should the provision by the Contractor of a technical rationale for the non-feasibility of an outcome fail to result in agreement between HSI management and the Contractor's management on the contents of the Statement of Outcomes, either party may request adjudication from the assigned ICE Contracting Officer (CO), who shall make a determination within five (5) business days of receipt of the adjudication request as to whether or not the disputed outcome(s) shall be included in the Statement of Outcomes. In the event that HSI's priorities change during the period of time covered by a Statement of Outcomes and HSI requests that the Statement of Outcomes be amended, and the Contractor determines that this new request for work does not clearly fall within the scope of the existing Statement of Outcomes, the Contractor may present the change request to the CO, who shall review the request to determine whether HSI's request falls within the scope of that document. Such determinations must be made within five (5) business days of the escalation request. The Contractor will not be obligated to take any action on the new request for work unless and until the CO, in coordination with the Contractor, approves the request and determines that such request falls within the scope of an existing Statement of Outcomes or otherwise amends such document to include the new request for work. In the event the CO and Contractor are unable to reach an agreement, the matter will be referred to ICE's Head of Contracting Authority (HCA) for final adjudication. For any priority tasks outside the scope of the existing Statement of Outcomes, HSI may request a level of effort from Contractor; Contractor shall not be obligated to perform such tasks unless (i) the task consists of high priority case work and is specifically requested by the Executive Assistant Director of HSI (or his/her designee); and (ii) a required task of a comparable level of effort is explicitly postponed or eliminated.

1.0 BACKGROUND

Appendix B-1 shall be considered an addendum to Section 5.8 of the Performance Work Statement: Additional Work to Be Performed During the Initial POP, Option Years 1-2, and the Optional Six-Month Extension.

During the twelve-month period 5/28/2016 to 5/27/2017, or longer if mutually agreed to by the parties, the Contractor shall perform configuration, integration, and training services for the following projects, which are not presented in priority order. The parties shall mutually agree to the list priorities and project timelines.

2.0 PROJECT PLANS AND SCHEDULES

The Contractor shall submit to the FALCON Program Manager and the FALCON COR/ACOR no later than ten work days after the beginning of a contract year a draft Schedule of Outcomes, listing the planned start dates of each planned outcome-based project. Based upon this Schedule of Outcomes, the Contractor shall submit to the FALCON Program Manager and the FALCON COR/ACOR no later than ten working days prior to the initiation of work on a particular outcome-based project a Project Plan and a Project Schedule. The one exception shall be for the first of the planned outcome-based projects, for which a Project Plan and a Project Schedule shall be delivered by the Contractor concurrently with delivery of the draft Schedule of Outcomes.

Project Plans, mutually agreed to by HSI and the Contractor, shall identify specific user groups, workflows and discrete tasks. The Project Plans will define the agreed upon scope of each outcome – any and all changes to the Project Plans must be mutually agreed upon by the parties and documented in weekly and/or monthly reports. Specifically, any addition of a new task within the Project Plan must be mutually agreed upon by the parties, and counterbalanced with the deletion or delay of an existing task of equal effort, as documented in weekly and/or monthly reports. Project Schedules shall list high-level tasks for a specified outcome-based project. Project Plans and Schedules may be amended by the two parties' mutual agreement.

Government delay has prevented delivery of 2015 - 2016 Period of Performance Outcomes 2, 3, and 7 prior to the conclusion of the Base Period; work associated with these Outcomes shall be referred to as "Residual Outcome Work." For Residual Outcome Work from the prior contract performance period, which will need to be completed at no additional cost during the current contract performance period, the Contractor shall deliver Revised Schedules, broken out by Outcome, no later than twenty-one (21) working days following the initiation of the current

contract performance period. These Revised Schedules shall be finalized through consultations and agreement between the Contractor and the FALCON PMO.

Regarding delay of work caused by government action or inaction, Equitable Adjustments shall take the form of adjustments in schedule with no penalty to the Contractor. In cases of extraordinary delay caused by government action or inaction (completion of work by the Contractor is anticipated to be delayed beyond one additional Period of Performance; for example, from the Base POP into Option Year 2), the government and the Contractor shall mutually agree upon a change in contract scope, at no penalty to the Contractor, whereby more feasible work of a similar magnitude shall be substituted for the work affected by an extraordinary delay. Equitable Adjustments shall not take the form of additional monetary compensation to the Contractor, due to the contract's Firm Fixed Price.

3.0 PROJECT MANAGEMENT

As part of the Draft Project Plan for each planned outcome-based project, Contractor shall identify a project lead, who will (a) coordinate all Contractor work on that particular outcomebased project; (b) manage the Project Plan and Project Schedule; and (c) report on progress and achievement of project milestones at weekly meetings with the FALCON PMO Team and to inquiries made by the FALCON Program Manager or other HSI authorities. At the Contractor's discretion, a particular employee may be assigned as project lead for more than one outcome-based project.

In addition to weekly progress meetings, the Contractor shall provide (a) quarterly briefings to which all HSI Unit Chiefs are invited to participate; and (b) twice yearly briefings to the Executive Steering Committee (ESC), coordinated with the October '16 and April '17 ESC meetings, on progress and achievement of project milestones across all outcomes.

The FALCON Program Manager shall identify a governmental project lead for each planned outcome-based project. This governmental project lead will (a) identify governmental Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) as necessary for requirements gathering, user feedback, and user testing; (b) facilitate meetings between governmental SMEs and Contractor staff; (c) coordinate agreements between the FALCON PMO and other bodies within ICE or other governmental agencies required for exchanges of data necessary for the accomplishment of the outcome-based project; (d) review/approve all changes to the Project Plan and/or Project Schedule proposed by the Contractor; and (d) alert the FALCON Program Manager and the FALCON COR/ACOR whenever schedule breeches are anticipated to occur or other problems arise which may adversely impact either project quality or the achievement of project deadlines.

All training activities conducted in support of these outcomes must be coordinated, in advance, with the FALCON Program Management Office (PMO).

During the first week of February, Contractor's project leads will meet with the FALCON PMO and other key stakeholders identified by the government to present status updates regarding any Outcome work which the Contractor estimates will not be completed by the end of the current

Period of Performance.
