Dear Ms. McCall:

This is in response to your August 23, 2010 Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests and then modified on September 16, 2010 for "all communications in the possession of the Department of Defense between the agency and any representative, officer, or member of Project Vigilant," and "all contracts, agreements, or memoranda of understanding in the possession of the Department of Defense concerning Project Vigilant and the company "BBHC Global." Your initial request was received on September 1, 2010 and assigned it 10-F-1503.

The Office of the Under Secretary of Defense for Intelligence (USD (I)), a component of the Office of the Secretary of Defense, searched its files for records such as those described in your request. The USD (I) concluded its search, however, without finding any responsive records.

The Networks and Information Integration (NII), has also searched its files for records such as those described in your request. NII concluded its search without finding any responsive records.

In addition, the Office of the Under Secretary of Defense for Policy has conducted a without finding responsive records.

If you are not satisfied with this action, you may appeal to the appellate authority, the Director of Administration and Management, Office of the Secretary of Defense, by writing directly to the Defense Freedom of Information Policy Office, Attn: Mr. James Hogan, 1155 Defense Pentagon, Washington, D.C. 20301-1155. Your appeal should be postmarked within 60 calendar days of the date of this letter, should cite to case number 10-F-1503, and should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal."
