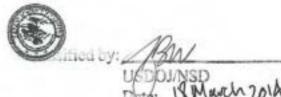

H. Pen Register/Trap and Trace Surveillance (U)

During 1999 and 2000, the FBI filed 18 applications with the FISC to conduct pen register/trap and trace surveillance, pursuant to 50 U.S.C. §§ 1841-1846. The FISC approved all 18 applications.
