H. Pen Register/Trap and Trace Surveillance (U)

During 1999 and 2000, the FBI filed 18 applications with the FISC to conduct pen register/trap and trace surveillance, pursuant to 50 U.S.C. §§ 1841-1846. The FISC approved all 18 applications. Five of these applications were filed with the Court in 1999, and thirteen applications were filed with the Court in 2000. This report contains statistics regarding all individuals who are subjects of full FBI foreign counterintelligence investigations related to each application


