Dear Mr. Hoofnagle:

This is in further reference to your June 22, 2001, Freedom of Information Act request for access to all records "relating to transactions, communications, and contracts concerning businesses that sell individuals' personal information." By letter dated October 22, 2002, this Office advised you that a search of pertinent files and record systems had been conducted and no responsive records had been located. However, in response to your access request to the FBI, that agency located one document which originated with the Office of Intelligence Policy & Review (OIPR) and referred it to us for review.

Upon receiving this document, which had not been located in our initial computerized database search, we conducted a manual search of our offices and located one file responsive to your request that contains twenty documents, including the memorandum referred by the FBI. We have completed our review of this material which is categorized as follows:

- 1. Requests for Legal Opinion (RLO) three documents (#1 3)
- 2. OIPR responses (including drafts) to RLO six documents (#4 9)
- 3. Electronic mail five documents (#10 14)
- 4. Handwritten notes five documents (#15 19)
- 5. Reference material one document (#20)

Within category #1, portions of document #2 are being released to you. The names of OIPR staff have been redacted from this document pursuant to Exemptions 6 and 7(C) of the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. §552 (b)(6) and (b)(7)(C). Documents #1 and 3 originated with the FBI and have been referred to that agency for review and direct response to you. Within category #2, portions of documents #5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 are being released to you.

The remaining material is exempt from disclosure pursuant to Exemptions 1, 5, 6 and 7(C) of the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. §552 (b)(1), (b)(5), (b)(6) and (b)(7)(C). Within category #3, portions of each of these documents are being released to you. The redacted portions are exempt from disclosure pursuant to Exemptions 1, 5, 6 and 7(C). Within category #4, portions of document #15 are being released to you. The remaining material is exempt from disclosure pursuant to Exemptions 1, 5, 6 and 7(C). Within category #5, this document originated with the Criminal Division and has been referred to that office for review and direct response to you.

Exemption 1 pertains to information which is properly classified in the interest of national security pursuant to Executive Order 12958, as amended. The applicable section in this instance is 1.5(c) intelligence activities. Exemption 5 pertains to certain inter- and intraagency communications protected by the deliberative process privilege. Exemption 6 pertains to information the release of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of third parties. Exemption 7(C) pertains to records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, the release of which could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of third parties.

If you are not satisfied with this response you may administratively appeal by writing to the Co-Director, Office of Information and Privacy, United States Department of Justice, Flag Building, Suite 570, Washington, D.C. 20530-0001, within sixty days from the date of this letter. Both the letter and envelope should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal."


