We have reviewed your letter and understand that the Government is now prepared to destroy the state voter data that was collected by the Presidential Advisory Commission on Election Integrity in 2017. We do not oppose the deletion of data from state voter rolls that was provided to the Commission in response to Mr. Kobach's request, and we do not assert any litigation hold over the data.

We do not consent to the destruction of any other materials, including but not limited to requests for state voter data, responses to requests for state voter data, communications with state officials or other individuals or entities about state voter data or requests for such data, and other documents concerning state voter data or requests for such data. We do request that you confirm (1) that no copies of the state voter data have been made, and (2) which states provided voter data to the Commission.
