**Supplemental Response**

This is the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) supplemental response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, dated March 31, 2017, to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS), Privacy Office. Your FOIA request sought information pertaining to the interference with the elections for Federal office held in 2016 by or at the direction of the Russian Government and is currently the subject of litigation in EPIC v. DHS, 1:17-cv-02047 (D.D.C.).

A total of 1435 pages of records were reviewed for this release. The 1435 pages of records were derived from a search of records from the CISA, Office of Chief of Staff and Office of the Chief Counsel. Following review, CISA has determined that one page is releasable its entirety and 17 pages of records are partially releasable pursuant to Exemption 5 and 6 of the FOIA. In addition, 88 pages are being withheld in their entirety pursuant to Exemptions 5 and 6 of the FOIA. CISA has also determined that of the remaining pages 18 pages are duplicative, 1,283 pages are non-responsive, four pages require consultation with another agency and 24 pages are under the purview of the Office of the Director of National Intelligence and have been referred for processing and direct response to you.

In additional, CISA conducted another review of 159 pages that were previously withheld in full in a previous release. CISA has determined that 131 pages are releasable in their entirety, 10 pages are partially releasable pursuant to Exemptions 5 and 6 of the FOIA and 18 pages are being withheld in their entirety pursuant to Exemptions 5 and 7(E) of the FOIA.
