SUBJECT: Department of Defense Support for the National Security Commission on Artificial

- On January 9, 2019, you met with the Vice Chair of the National Security Commission on Artificial Intelligence (NSCAI), HON Bob Work, to discuss Department of Defense (DoD) support for the newly established NSCAI.
- You agreed to his request that you sign a memorandum, after internal coordination, directing DoD organizations to provide information to NSCAI, approved return rights for civilian personnel hired by NSCAI, and authorized DoD organizations to enter into support agreements with NSCAI.
- The memorandum at TAB A was coordinated through the General Counsel of the Department of Defense (TAB B).

**SUBJECT: Department of Defense Support for the National Security Commission on Artificial  
Intelligence**

In keeping with the National Defense Strategy guidance to accelerate technological advancements, DoD organizations will support the efforts of the National Security Commission on Artificial Intelligence ("the Commission"), an independent commission of the Federal government established by section 1051 of the John S. McCain National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2019. The Commission has my full support in all requests for data or information that may be relevant to its research or fact-finding. As such, the Office of the Secretary of Defense and DoD Component heads are directed to support and promptly facilitate the work of the Commission by ensuring the Commissioners and their staff members have access to all relevant personnel and information necessary to perform their duties, consistent with the requirements and limitations of law.

The Joint Artificial Intelligence Center (JAIC), under the direction of the DoD Chief Information Officer, will lead liaison efforts with the Commission on behalf of DoD, and will form a virtual coordination cell for the purposes of ensuring appropriate communication and coordination on matters that advance the interests of the Department. This liaison function will include virtual representatives from other offices within DoD currently working on the development and implementation of AI, at the discretion of the Director of the JAIC.

DoD Components will support requests from the Commission to appoint DoD civilian employees serving under a career or career conditional appointment or the equivalent to positions with the Commission, unless the DoD Component can provide me with significant, demonstrated negative impact. DoD Components will grant such employees appointed on request of the Commission return rights to the employee's former position or a position in the same commuting area of like seniority, status, and pay, without grade or pay retention based on grade or pay at the Commission. To be eligible for return rights, (1) the employee's separation from the Commission must be for reasons other than misconduct, neglect of duty or malfeasance and (2) the employee must apply for return no later than 30 days before the earlier of the date of the employee's termination from the Commission or the date of the termination of the temporary organization. The Chief Management Officer of the Department of Defense will work with affected DoD Components with respect to relief from personnel caps, where feasible.

Finally, if requested by the Commission, DoD offices and organizations are authorized to enter into service agreements with the Commission at their discretion and under terms agreed upon by the Commission and the DoD office or organization.

Monique and Megan,

With regards to funding the Commission on AI (per Section 1051 of the FY 2019 NDAA), the INV team is sourcing the \$10M from RDT&E,DW since R&D is the main appropriation associated with AI. Section 1051 allows us to fund the commission from any amounts authorized to be appropriated within the Act. (b)(5)

The process that is used to transfer the funding to the Commission involves the following: a new Treasury account needs to be set up under TI48 (non-DoD), a letter transfer would be need to be

signed, OMB would reapportion the funds, and Treasury would issue a warrant to the Commission. Typically, the Commission would then enter into a MOA with WHS to receive financial services. Once the Commission sends the funding to WHS, WHS would take on the responsibilities of processing pay, travel, contracts, etc.

Anne and Monique,

(b)(6) from the DSD's office wanted to highlight a provision in the NDAA requiring the creation of a national security commission on AI. IT requires appointments for various bodies including the SD, which they are rapidly working on accomplishing before the expiration date. In addition, it also includes language directing that not more than \$10M shall be available for the commission to carry out its duties. (b)(6) wanted to make sure we were aware of the funding requirement (cut and pasted below for easy access).

(d) FUNDING.-Of the amounts authorized to be appropriated by this Act for fiscal year 2019 for the Department of Defense, not more than \$10,000,000 shall be made available to the Commission to carry out its duties under this subtitle. Funds made available to the Commission under the preceding sentence shall remain available until expended.

The two key HASC staffers who are putting this together reached out to me for guidance last week and shared their thinking (described below).

Congress established this National-level Commission focused on AI and national security/defense via Sec 1051 of FY19 NDAA, following Project Maven supporter Rep Elise Stefanik's recommendation.

The scope of the Commission has a major Venn diagram overlap with JAIC. Summarized:

Maintaining advantage in AI for national security/defense applications.

Establishment of data standards, sharing of open training data for national security/defense applications.

Private/public/academic/combined initiatives to apply AI to national security/defense (note: HADR).

Risks of foreign advances, law of armed conflict, international humanitarian law, escalation dynamics.  
Military ethics and AI safety.  
Workforce incentives, attracting leading talent.  
US national security/defense competitiveness in AI, including public-private partnerships and investments.  
Evolution of AI for national security/defense.  
Foreign investment and international cooperation and competitiveness.

The intent of Congress is for an organization within DoD to be the "lead"/executive agent. Up to \$10M is being authorized as FY19 reprogramming to accomplish. The thinking is that the Commission will use that funding to bring on 7-10 talented new AI staff members and have funds for travel, studies, etc. Chosen Commissioners will have a high degree of discretion on how to execute. Template is recent "Public Service Commission."

Congressional staff has talked to CIO and will be talking to USD(R&E) to obtain support, and to OSTP to synchronize with their AI efforts. There will be a letter from HASC and SASC (+maybe HAC-D, SAC-D) emphasizing DoD lead role and authorized funding language.
