This upgrade will increase the AFIS' processing capacity and processing speed to provide the CJIS Division with the interim technical capacity to timely process the ever increasing number of fingerprint submissions, which is a critical part of CJIS Division's mission. Increased capacity issues will be more thoroughly addressed during the acquisition of Next Generation Identification (NGI) technology; in the meantime, this interim solution will permit the FBI to meet its current mission needs.

As background, the FBI maintains an automated database that integrates criminal history records including arrest information and corresponding disposition information, submitted by Federal, State, local, tribal, and certain foreign criminal justice agencies. Currently, the FBI maintains criminal history records on more than 56 million different individuals, with many of the individuals having multiple entries of separate encounters with the criminal justice system. These records are searchable for various established purposes, and the preliminary electronic search is performed by the FBI's Integrated Automated Fingerprint Identification System (IAFIS).

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The FBI has established the Fingerprint Identification Record System (FIRS) (Justice/FBI-009) as a Privacy Act system of records to support identification and criminal history record information functions for local, state, tribal, and federal criminal justice agencies, and for noncriminal justice agencies and other entities where authorized by federal statute, statute pursuant to Public Law 92-544, Presidential executive order, or regulation or order of the Attorney General of the United States. (See 28 CFR 20.31; (64 FR 52343, 52347).) IAFIS is a component of the FIRS, providing an automated fingerprint search capability, latent fingerprint search capability, electronic image storage, and electronic exchange of fingerprints and responses 24/7. AFIS is in turn the component of IAFIS which actually processes the automated fingerprint comparisons conducted by IAFIS.

## A. General System Description: Please briefly describe:

### Type of information in the system:

In the instance of a line-of-duty officer death, the case agent from the jurisdictional FBI field office sends a notification EC to the FBI's LEOKA program. Within this EC, details include the description of the circumstances surrounding the death; victim officer's name, rank, date of birth, and law enforcement experience; offender's name, age, and current status, such as deceased, at large, or arrested and charged; and survivor information, such as names, ages, addresses, and relationships to the victim officer. In addition, the LEOKA program is notified of officer assaults involving injury with firearms or knives/other cutting instruments by the monthly UCR collection. This monthly collection is aggregate totals only and does not include any personal information.

In response to both notifications, the LEOKA program's staff requests that the victim officer's employing agency complete Form 1-701, "Analysis of Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted," to obtain additional details concerning the circumstances surrounding the incident. For line-of-duty deaths, Form 1-701 is provided to the victim officer's employing agency via the case agent from the jurisdictional FBI field office, and for officer assault incidents, Form 1-701 is provided to the victim officer's employing agency via the State Program or directly by the LEOKA program's staff. Form 1-701 is used to collect the victim officer's name, rank, total law enforcement experience, date of birth, gender, race, height, weight, and circumstances surrounding the death or assault of the officer. Offender data collected includes name, date of birth, gender, race, height, weight, place of birth, current or known residence, FBI number, and criminal history. Upon receipt of the completed Form 1-701, the information is stored within an electronic database utilizing Access software.

NAME OF SYSTEM:

Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted

If an officer has been feloniously killed, the International Justice and Public Safety Information Sharing Network (Nlets) is utilized to transmit an All-Points Bulletin message providing preliminary information concerning the circumstances surrounding the felonious death of an officer. These Nlets messages are also stored in the electronic LEOKA database.

The above-mentioned survivor information is maintained by the LEOKA program's staff in paper-based format; however, it is not currently stored in the electronic LEOKA database. The victim officer's agency information; victim's name, age, and law enforcement experience; survivors' names, ages of children, and addresses; and a brief description of the incident are provided to the White House for condolence purposes.

a. If the system is solely related to internal government operations please provide a brief explanation of the quantity and type of employee/contractor information:

Not applicable.

2. Purpose for collecting the information and how it will be used:

Officer killed information is collected to report the number of incidents and to help law enforcement/data users better understand the situations which lead to officer deaths. Also, contributing law enforcement agencies report their officer assaults, identifying the instances that resulted in injuries. In addition, contributing law enforcement agencies provide expanded data on those officers who sustained personal injury from a firearm or a knife/other cutting instrument. Officers killed and assaulted data are collected and annually published in an effort to assist law enforcement training programs and ultimately improve officer safety. However, these publications do not contain personally identifiable information.

3. The system's structure (including components/subsystems):
