UNOPPOSED MOTION TO MODIFY BRIEFING SCHEDULE

Defendant Federal Bureau of Investigation ("FBI"), with Plaintiff Electronic Privacy Information Center's ("EPIC") consent, hereby respectfully requests that the Court modify its August 9, 2017 order to enlarge by six days the time period for the FBI to file its combined opposition to EPIC's cross-motion for summary judgment and reply in support of its motion for summary judgment.

Good cause exists to grant this motion. On November 15, 2017, EPIC filed a forty-page brief in opposition to the FBI's motion for summary judgment and in support of EPIC's cross-motion. Under the operative briefing schedule, the FBI's combined opposition and reply brief is due on December 5, 2017. *See* ECF No. 19. The FBI seeks an additional six days to file its combined brief due to the Thanksgiving holiday and other litigation demands on undersigned counsel, including the filing of significant motions for summary judgment in *Bauer v. DeVos*, 17-cv-1330-RDM (D.D.C.), and *Massachusetts v. DeVos*, 17-cv-1331-RDM (D.D.C.). This additional time will allow the FBI to adequately respond to the many issues raised in EPIC's brief.

Undersigned counsel conferred with counsel for EPIC about this request, and EPIC consents to it. In order to maintain the timing of the original briefing schedule, the FBI further requests that EPIC be granted an equivalent six-day enlargement of time in which to file its reply brief.

For these reasons, the FBI respectfully requests that the Court modify its August 9, 2017 briefing schedule as follows:

The FBI shall have until December 11, 2017 to file its combined reply in support of its motion for summary judgment and opposition to EPIC's cross-motion.

Plaintiff shall have until December 21, 2017 to file its reply brief in support of its cross-motion for summary judgment.

A proposed order reflecting this proposal is attached.
